Although the event was primarily organized and sponsored by and for *Teams of Our Lady* couples, Resurrection Parish opened their doors and hearts and many in the parish helped make the event a huge success from child care, to music directors and choir members, Eucharistic Ministers, and staff alike. It was truly a "family" event.

Brother Cyril Drnjevic (OSB) from Mt Abbey led much of the day long event, providing deeply reflective and inspiring marriage related talks on both "Living in Mercy Through the Eucharist" and "Living in Mercy through Spiritual Healing From Jesus." ### INTERNATIONAL GATHERING

July 16 - 21, 2018 - Fatima Portugal

As the International Leading Couple for the Teams of Our Lady, you announced at the most recent International College at Swanwick that the 12th International Gathering of Team members would be held in Fatima, Portugal, from July 16 to 21, 2018. Can you give us the reasons for choosing this place?

Fatima was chosen by the Regional Responsible Couples who took part in the International Regional Responsible Couples' Gathering in Rome in 2015. The International Leading Team consulted all the responsible couples present and the Sanctuary of Fatima was chosen with a majority of over 60%.

### What role do the International Gatherings play in the life of the Movement?

They are important moments when the international aspect of the Movement can be experienced as a whole and when the new orientations of the Movement as defined by the ERI (International Leading Team) every six years can be announced. These orientations are proposals that aim to help the Teams of Our Lady to truly journey together in unity.

# Father Henri Caffarel associated big gatherings with pilgrimages. What do you think of that?



Therefore, our great concern will be to figure out the role of a true Mission of Love, full of mercy and joy, just like the one we are in particular need of today.

# News from our Provincial Couple! **New Teams Meeting**

New Teams Celebration!!!

The New Teams Celebration, (NTC), -as we would like to call the New Teams Meeting, (NTM), is a time for sharing with friends and between the couple, themselves. It is also a time of synthesis that allows reviewing the discoveries made along the first phase of piloting in team meetings. It is an important step for the new teams; allowing greater awareness of the small community and the larger community of the Teams of Our Lady Movement, which is at their service.

At the NTC (NTM) there will be 25-35 couples from 4-6 newly piloted teams at this celebration weekend. The weekend is a retreat type setting and cost will be borne by the couples. The object of this final phase of piloting, is to introduce new teams to one another and to experience the wider movement firsthand. This does not replace the endeavor of the yearly retreat, but acts as the final phase of the Piloting process.

Joining a new team is an experience in our quest to know Christ in our Sacrament. However, the newly formed team and its intimate setting oftentimes leads to the turning in upon itself, which denies our effectiveness and obligation to become part of a worldwide Movement of Spirituality.

In the single team, we give mutual help to our team members, but oftentimes fail to see our obligation to the Movement and to the world at large. This NTC experience encourages us to turn outward toward our fellow man.

The NTC (NTM) is facilitated by 3-4 couples that have been trained to lead the weekend. The four presentations will be:

Who guides us—Charisma and mystique

Where are we going—life guidelines, mission, witness and service

What guides us on the path—Endeavors and Sharing

Who is walking with us—Team life and Sharing

During this final weekend of the piloting there will be three mixed team meetings, presentations, time for a sit down and conjugal prayer.

The objectives of the NTC (NTM) are:

\* Provide an encounter with other teams

Review the methodology of the Movement

Celebrate the commitment of the couple and the team

Celebrate the reception of the new teams into the movement

Celebrate and strengthen the unit of the movement

The timing and cost of the NTC can be altered somewhat to accommodate the couples with children, cost of location, meals, etc. However, the content of this weekend is very important and needs to be experienced for the piloting process to be complete.

#### Who attends?


The 4-6 newly piloted teams who have completed their first year of Piloting, consisting of both books of Meeting Together In Christ's Name, Piloting I and II.

### Why?

To officially complete their piloting process and to achieve the sense of belonging to something larger than their own Team.

#### When?

Over the course of a weekend: Friday evening, 6:00 pm until 9:00 pm Saturday, 8:30 am to 5:00 pm Sunday, 8:30 am to 11:00 am concluding with Eucharistic Celebration
