



Unity of the Movement and the Role of LIAISON COUPLES



The Cluster Meeting consists of the Liaison Couple with the RCs of their assigned teams. Each Liaison Couple keeps in frequent contact with their assigned teams and meets with each team once a year.

Boise Team 01 had a wonderful group retreat to McCall, Idaho on Memorial Day weekend 2017. The retreat was set up on the long weekend to give the couples an opportunity to spend time getting to know each other in the days leading up to the retreat and after the retreat. There was some biking, hiking, trips to Ice Cream Alley, and of course the morning walks to the coffee shop. The retreat itself was held on the Monday (Memorial Day) and used Gary Chapman's 5 Love Languages as the retreat material. Typically recommended as a retreat on 2 evenings the timing for our group worked best to have a morning and afternoon session to cover the retreat material. We discussed the 5 Love Languages and spent the day focusing on how to apply the love languages to our marriages. "Many of us were shocked to find that our love languages have changed throughout the course of our marriage. It was also a good reminder to check in with each other regularly to see how full our love tanks are", said Katy Privon.

The Team all commented that we loved this kind environment where it's safe to focus on marriage with other Catholics in support. There was even a light hearted ice breaker between the two sessions followed by a 2 hour period for date lunch and time for each couple to reflect on the morning's material and have some time to check-in. In addition to the material provided by the retreat, the whole team spent the previous night all in one cabin sharing meals, relaxing, and getting to know each other outside of the monthly TOOL meeting.

In summary, the material was perfectly laid out for a first Teams retreat to be planned and executed by the team. The videos and material are easy to follow and provide a great opportunity for spouses to get to know each other on a deeper level and have actionable steps to take in improving their marriages. When was the last time you asked your spouse "On a scale of 1 being empty and 10 being full, how full is your love tank today?"

RETREATS

There are several options for team couples to fulfill their annual retreat endeavor:

- self-directed,
- retreat master directed,
- outside married couple retreat.

This Boise 01 team elected to do a self-directed retreat in McCall, Idaho focused on the Love Languages. Portland OR Sector B has also done self-directed retreats at the Griffin Center in Portland, where couples were also in charge of the meal preparation and clean-up.

Last year when Sector A planned their retreat they used a retreat master, as they've done in previous years, who provided the material and the theme for the retreat held at Queen of Peace Retreat House in Beaverton, OR.

Mt Angel Abbey is a beautiful and inspiring place for either a private or directed retreats. This year Mt Angel Retreat Center is sponsoring a Marian Retreat on Oct 27-29 and an Advent Retreat on Dec 1-3. Please note, each retreat costs only \$302/ couple.

Teams of Our Lady Retreats need not solely be for Team couples but may also be opened up to Catholic married couples within the Archdiocese or Diocese. It provides the Movement an opportunity to evangelize the beauty of this ministry and encourage other married catholic couples and their families to center their lives on Christ.
