





Miracle by Father Caffarel in Miami

We had on August 15th the worst tragedy at our Sector. One couple from Miami Team #1 had their baby David drown at their home pool. David stayed 9 minutes under the water, and when they rescued him he had no pulse or vital signs.

In this moment God was present and a 25 year old neighbor, with the same name of the baby boy, administered CPR and revived the baby yet he didn't regain consciousness.

David stayed at the hospital 8 days in a coma on life support. We quickly took action as Teams and started a huge Prayer Chain in our Sector that spread throughout the USA, Brazil, Honduras, Colombia across Teams, families and friends. Everybody prayed for the intercession of Father Caffarel for a miracle to save this boy and help his family. We had the chance to pray, together as a Sector, his canonization prayer in our last Retreat on August 19th.


The next day, on August 20th they had the final MRI exam to check the mental issues that David could have had and it was our first signal of miracle, They confirmed that David didn't have any mental damage from the incident!

Little by little David is recovering, and now is eating, has been breastfed by his mom, and he has the chance to get out of the hospital with life and health for his 12th month Birthday on September 6th!

We all are testimony of this Miracle by Father Caffarel inside our Miami Team # 1 and we are so blessed to have participated in that. Our faith grows each second that we think about it and we are so grateful to God!

We have already communicated the event to Friends of Father Caffarel Association in France. God bless Teams!

After being blessed by the many graces that come with being part of a base team for

four years, Philip and Melissa said yes to God's call and were appointed as sector couple for Hillsborough, Florida in 2017, excited by the vision shared with them by Chad and Raquel, the southeast regional couple, of what sectors all over the world were accomplishing with sector teams. Yet, the task was daunting. The sector had been without a leadership team for decades and found itself limping along carried on by the sacrificial leadership of overburdened solo sector couples.

Not sure where to start, Philip and Melissa, asked a priest to serve as their sector spiritual counselor,

and he said yes. Melissa remembers, "We were so thrilled by this first victory and saw it as a sign of God's blessing." They began working to get to know their sector. After many phone calls they were able to hold a "get to know you" meeting with the responsible couples, then they began scheduling liaison visits to their teams. The challenges of finding a baby sitter for their young kids meant that it was often the case that Philip would visit a team solo and then Melissa would do the same next month. Slowly, but surely they began getting to know their sector.

Following sector couple training in Texas they arrived back in Florida excited about the movement and motivated to built their sector team. Philip recalls, "I struggled with fear. We talked back and forth about our worries of choosing the wrong couples and our concern with being rejected when we did ask. Yet, we knew this was something we had to do." God was moving and their sector was growing. They had held an information to infill their own team and so many couples responded that a second team was formed. Another couple volunteered to share about teams at a marriage event at their parish and the result was two new teams being formed. Before they knew it, their sector had grown to twelve teams. This rapid growth increased the urgency to build a sector team.

So, they took the leap and invited a prospective liaison couple to their house for coffee and shared with them the vision for a sector team and asked them to pray about serving as liaison couple. A week later they said yes. Soon afterward another couple who attended a regional teams training event also said yes to service as a liaison couple. With these success, their courage began to grow. They called a few other couples, two of whom said no, but two others said yes.


Joe and Donna Zeoli have accepted the call to be the Responsible Couple for the Pinellas Sector, their installation date slated for this Fall.

Message from the Pope

Dear ResponsibleCouple MARIA BERTA and JOSÉ MOURA SOARES of TOL's International Leading Team

It is with pleasure that I welcome the request for blessing all the participants of the 12th International Gathering of Teams Our Lady which takes place in Fatima from July 16 to 21, 2018, under the theme "The Prodigal Son". Pope Francis greets you fraternally, reminding everyone that the Church condemns sin, because it must speak the truth, but at the same time embraces the sinner who recognizes himself as such, approaches Him and speaks about God's infinite mercy. What great hope and what joy the parable of the Prodigal Son brings us! It does not only speak to us of welcome or forgiveness, but also of "feast" for the son who returns. (Luke 15:32).

The Holy Father invites us to recognize ourselves in this lost son who returns to the Father. This Father who never tires of hugging him and restoring his greatness as a son. Let us be moved by such great kindness and let our hearts speak: It is true, Lord!I am a sinner. I feel as such and I'm sure of being it. I'm lost. In a thousand ways, I have shunned your love, but here I am to renew my covenant with you. I need you. Save me once again Lord! Take me, once more, into your redeeming arms (*Evangelii Gaudium 3*)

These open arms on the cross prove that no one is excluded from the Father's love, from his mercy. He does not want to lose anyone, moreover, He does not resign himself to losing anyone: husband or wife, parents or children ... You are well aware, that in the eyes of Jesus, nobody is definitely lost, there are only people who need to be found, and, He pushes us to go out looking for them. For if we want to find the Lord, we must seek Him where He wants to meet us and not where we want to find Him; the Shepherd can only be found where the sheep is lost. While informing us that He leaves in search of the lost sheep, He encourages the ninety-nine to participate in the reunification of the flock. And if that happens, it's not just the sheep that He carries on the shoulders and takes home that will make a party with friends and neighbors, but also the whole flock. (Luke 15:4-6).

Thus "taken by the hand by the Virgin Mary and under her gaze, we can joyfully sing the Lord's mercies. We can say to Him: My soul is singing for you Lord! The mercy you have used with your saints and with all your faithful people has spread to me. Because of the pride of my heart, I lived focused on my ambitions and my interests, but I did not occupy any throne, Lord! The only possibility of delight that I have is that your Mother takes me in her arms, covers me with her cloak and places me near your Heart ".

(Pope Francis' Message: introduction to the Marian Vigil, Fátima 12/5/2017).

Thus, consecrated to the merciful hearts of Jesus and Mary, you can count on their grace, just as, a hundred years ago, through the Virgin Mother of God, grace shone in the eyes of the three little shepherds and shaped their lives with the purpose of "saving sinners". 
Dear Teams of Our Lady Family:

We want to THANK YOU for your generosity in contributing this past year to the Teams Movement in the United States. The number of couples contributing increased from less than 20% to 29%.

As you know, the Teams of Our Lady Charter sets out the responsibilities for each couple and specifically identifies the need "to give annually, by way of subscription the equivalent of one day's pay." Our annual expenses typically include website, printing materials, postage, translations, and primarily leadership training and travel. Another primary expense is the tithe assessed to each country by the international body (ERI) based on GNP and membership, to support the International movement around the world.

This year we are starting leadership meetings and trainings where all the Provinces (4) will meet with their Team (Regional Couples) and all their College (Sector Couples) and this process, so needed in the USA, will increase the costs for Teams. This process is in place at the ERI level and in the Super Regions worldwide.

Teams are accepting contributions in three different ways: 1) Through the Teams' website, www.teamsofourlady.org/contributions which allows you to do one yearly contribution or to contribute monthly; 2) through Bill Pay; 3) Placing your contribution in an envelope and giving it to your RC/Sector Couple.



This year again, to propel our participation closer to 100


percent, Sector Couples will manage the annual contribution process. As part of these efforts, during a fall meeting your Responsible Couple will provide you with an envelope for your contribution. The sealed contributions will then be sent to the Sector Couple who will track, not the amount contributed, but rather the name of the couple participating (only the SR Responsible Couple and Secretariat will see your contribution). We emphasize here the importance of submitting an envelope even if your contribution is less than the recommended amount or if you give online or by Bill Pay. Note that cash contributions are not recommended or paying by one team check. Remember to note on your check or bill pay your Region, Sector, and Team number. Please know that you and your teams are always in our prayers and Team members, both living and deceased, are remembered in a weekly Mass offered by the SR Spiritual Counselor. Father Caffarel shared with us that "everything withers when prayer is missing." Your continued support will help the USA Super Region grow and continue the <u>mission</u> of Teams.

Ancient Prayer In Honour of Our Lady's Nativity by St. Anselm

Give me strength to praise thee in prayer with all my powers, through the merits of thy most sacred nativity, which for the entire Christian world was a birth of joy, the hope and solace of its life.
