

Why is Discernment So Important as Followers of Christ?

uring the USA Super Region Meeting and College in June, the theme of discernment played a significant role. Upon my return to Houston, **Pope Leo** announced his Prayer intention for July: 'For formation in discernment.' How appropriate that the **Holy Father** is asking the Universal Church to pray for this intention. Discernment is a demanding yet indispensable process for living, involving the evaluation and choice of actions in accordance with God's will. It is an exercise of intelligence, skill, and will, aimed at seizing opportune moments to make good choices. This process is not limited to extraordinary circumstances or grave problems but is a continuous means of spiritual combat to follow the Lord more faithfully.

Key Aspects of Discernment

- Freedom and Choice: God created human beings with freedom and desires them to exercise it. Discernment involves evaluating and choosing, recognizing that choices have consequences for oneself, others, and the world. It is a path of freedom that brings to fruition the unique plan God has for each person.
- Daily Practice: Discernment is an everyday practice, applied to choices ranging from food and clothing to relationships and life projects. It helps in recognizing God's timetable and heeding the promptings of His grace, even in small and seemingly irrelevant matters.

Elements of Discernment:

- Knowledge, Experience, Emotion, Will: These are indispensable elements that contribute to the process of discernment.
- Familiarity with the Lord (Prayer): Prayer is a fundamental aid, especially in the affective dimension, allowing for familiar and straightforward communication with God, like speaking to a friend. True prayer fosters confidence and intimacy with God, making it easier to recognize what pleases Him.
- Word of God and Church Doctrine: Evaluating decisions in light of the Word of God and the Church's

- doctrine helps us recognize God's voice and distinguish it from other voices. God's voice is discreet, respectful, and humble, producing peace.
- Self-knowledge: Discernment requires knowing oneself and what is good for oneself in the present moment.
- Supernatural Gift: While discernment includes reason, prudence, and insights from human sciences, it transcends them as it is a grace. It seeks to understand God's unique and mysterious plan for everyone, which unfolds amidst various situations and limitations. It is not exclusive to the intelligent or educated, as God reveals Himself to the lowly.
- Guidance and Accompaniment: Discernment is not done alone. It is a synodal process, meaning it involves journeying with brothers and sisters in faith, enriching interior growth. A wise guide can help avoid mistakes and bewilderment in the journey of faith and vocational discovery.

In essence, discernment is a demanding but vital process that involves listening to the Lord, oneself, and others, requiring time for prayer, reflection, and patient expectation, ultimately leading to courageous and sacrificial decisions that align with God's will.

Sector Responsible Couple. The Winona Sector then held a Sector Day which included mass.



Regional College



Attending the College Meeting: The "Trini" Experience

Teams of Our Lady is an evolving movement. In a rapidly changing world, discerning opportunities and acting on them is crucial for the charism of Teams. Representing Trinidad and Tobago at our first USA Super Region College Meeting and Sector Couple Experience highlighted the immense value of making informed decisions, exchanging ideas, and applying international experiences to local contexts. This experience underscored how discerning the right opportunities, saying "yes" at the right moments, and building connections can reshape both spiritual growth and fraternal development.

The ability to discern is not just a gift but a vital skill in today's world. Whether it's recognizing trends in base teams, identifying couples for leadership roles, or developing the right training programs that align with Region or Sector needs, discernment guides decisions that lead to lasting success. During our first regional meeting, we were reminded of the importance of using this discernment to say "yes" to opportunities that can bring positive change. Reflection on a Lifetime in Teams

On June 9th, a number of Teams members attended the Mass of Christian Burial for Lolita Jardeleza (age 93), a member of Teams of Our Lady for 61 years. The May 2016 issue of the Mid-Atlantic Region Newsletter (of the East Province) published this article by Lolita. We have edited it to fit in the available space.

When my husband, Jack, and I used to give talks about the Teams of Our Lady, he claimed that we were born in it. We joined Teams in December, 1964. Our team, Washington 4, was one of the first ten teams in the Washington, D.C. area.... [Our team] consisted of four couples.... We had a series of chaplains... One might say that our most illustrious chaplain was Cardinal Sean O'Malley of Boston who was our chaplain in 1973.

I would say that our spiritual formation from [1964] on came totally from Teams. The notion of a married couple being spiritual together was quite new at the time.... The notion of finding holiness in their being married to each other was ground-breaking. Until Teams' focus on conjugal spirituality, couples strove towards holiness like a husband and a wife heading towards Richmond in separate cars—he in the Knights of Columbus, she in the Sodality. Then Abbe Caffarel and his first teams came up with the novel idea that couples should head for holiness traveling in the same car





with each other—that their vehicle for holiness was precisely their being married to each other.

At our first Teams retreat, the chaplain asked, "Do you discuss your spiritual life with each other?" One of the husbands asked, "What spiritual life?" It was heady stuff in the beginning. We had to learn mental prayer. I had trouble with that so I would ask priests and religious to explain it to me. Fr. Cordoue said, "Prayer that is not vocal is mental." We were to spend 10 minutes daily in mental prayer. So I would try and when I thought 10 minutes had passed, I would check my watch only to find that I had only prayed for 5 minutes. My cousin, Fr. Bernard, Carmelite vicar

of the Philippines, said,
"Empty your mind so
that you can hear the
Lord." I emptied my
mind and fell asleep. I
read all the books on
prayer I could lay my
hands on and after I
read one I couldn't pray
mentally for months, I
was so confused. Then I
heard Catherine Doherty
(foundress of Madonna
House) explain mental
prayer as thinking about God

the way one did when one first fell in love—first thing upon awakening, last thing before sleep at night. That I understood!...

There always seemed like a dearth of leaders back then and because there were not that many teams yet, they had to use Jack and me. I always believed that, were others available, we would not have been tapped. We were the first Responsible Couple of our team and also Liaison Couple to some teams. We piloted two Spanish teams in Miami in the late 60's by correspondence. We...were the first editors of the Magnificat....


In 1998, my beloved Jack went on to the Father. I did not want to leave

our Team—it was home for me. Not too long after, [two other members died and one couple moved to Florida]. We were decimated! Out of the six couples, we now consisted of three who were widowed and [two] couples. We eventually just stopped meeting.

However, in 1999, Rockville 4 lost their chaplain, Fr. Bill Talentino, OFM Cap. who was assigned to the Capuchin missions in Papua New Guinea. The team was unable to find someone to be their chaplain when he left and asked me if I would be willing to be their "chaplain." Happily, I was allowed to be that and irony of ironies, a widow now belonged to TWO teams!...

There was a time when I carried the history of Teams in the area in my head but that was back in the 70's.... As I enter my 84th year, this old gray mare just ain't what she used to be. In the late 70's the then Sector husband introduced Jack and me as the Team antiques. After 37 more years, what does that make me?

In Teams, however, one doesn't get fossilized. Teams somehow make us richer, like humus in forests. Our being in Teams led Jack into the diaconate,



our being involved with the Family Life Board and the archdiocese in the 80's, my going to Papua New Guinea as a missionary in 2001, teaching in the Philippines in 2003, being professed as a Secular Franciscan in 2005.... What I have learned about love and marriage and parenting in Teams I have taught in my Christian Lifestyle and Sex Respect classes at the Academy of the Holy Cross. What I have learned about prayer and walking with the Lord, I pass on in the retreats I give. The Teams ideals and values like openness, communication, building community, spiritual growth, deepening prayer and living out gospel values ripple farther and wider than we might think, please God.

What Teams does is attach us to the Vine that is the Lord and as long as we are attached, He makes us bear fruit. We don't have to grunt and groan to bear this fruit anymore than a grape or tomato has to. We simply have to let Him have His way with us and use us in the vineyard as He sees fit. Teams teaches us to grow into holiness by "doin' what comes natur'lly" after hanging out with the Lord and each other.

I earnestly pray that as I was born in Teams I will also die in Teams. Let us praise God mightily that we are members of the Teams of Our Lady!

Both obligations (endeavors) and membership responsibilities are to be incorporated into our life as a married Christian.

A Love Anchored in Faith

Mary & Jack Pulick's 54-Year Journey in Teams of Our Lady

On September 11, Jack and Mary Pulick celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary. They have been in Teams of Our Lady for 54 years. Their journey with Teams has been a big part of their story. They've always seen their marriage as something sacred and trusted in God's plan for them.

In the early days, they had their hands full with four kids and Jack juggling multiple jobs.
They felt a bit lost as a couple, but things changed when they found Teams of Our Lady in 1970. This movement gave them a community and spiritual tools that really helped their marriage and provided support to raise a total of eight children.

Over the years, they've been through a lot together. Their team supported each other through tough times, like serious illnesses. Mary and Jack also took on several leadership roles in Teams as well as starting new teams in Florida.

Even when they moved to an area in Maryland without Teams, they stayed committed, traveling monthly back to New York to stay involved. They credit the Movement's disciplines and Endeavors for keeping their marriage strong and focused on God, especially during tough times like Jack's cardiac arrest in June 2024.

For the past several years they have served as the USA Super Region Intercessor Liaison Couple. Over 60 years ago, Fr. Caffarel called Teams of Our Lady couples to become intercessors, a people of prayer. Intercessor couples commit to giving one hour each month praying for the Teams Movement to be authentic and to continue its mission of spreading the good news of Catholic Marriage throughout the world. Jack and Mary have been the USA Liaison to the International Intercessor group. They will be stepping away from this position and passing the torch to the next couple to take the reins. As Teams of Our Lady tells us, "The endeavors are attitudes to awaken within us and not merely tasks to be accomplished." Let's have an attitude of awakening and focus on the Rule of Life.

The Rule of Life is intended to be unique and personal to you, shared or not shared. It is to help you become increasingly aware of

who you are and who God is calling you to be. Learning to fully accept the truth about yourself in order to start building upon that is the goal of the Rule of Life.

To draw up a rule of life, we must first come to know ourselves, our strengths and weaknesses, and those areas in our lives on which we need to work. We should consider examining what is currently "ruling" our life to determine how we need to change. As Catholic author, Matthew Kelly, states, "Your essential purpose is to become the best-version-of-yourself." Your rule of life should help you with this.

Your Rule of Life should be SMART:

SPECIFIC – Be very specific on to what you want to focus

MEASURABLE – Be sure you can measure your progress


ACHIEVABLE – Be sure you can accomplish your rule if you set your mind to it

What is a Grace Received?

The Church recognizes "graces received" as those blessings that do not necessarily defy natural laws, but are a clear sign of God's love in the life of an individual or family. These experiences can help the faithful to grow in faith and strengthen their relationship with God and others.

Types of Graces Received: (through the intercession of Father Henri Caffarel)

1. Spiritual graces

- Personal conversion or that of a loved one.
- Deepening prayer and encounter with God.
- Vocational discernment or making an important life decision.
- Strength and peace in difficult times.

2. Graces in marriage and family

- Marital or family reconciliation.
- Blessings in motherhood/fatherhood.
- Overcoming marital crises.
- Transformation of married life according to marital spirituality.

3. Health-related graces

- Significant improvement in an illness or health condition.
- Peace of mind when facing a serious illness.
- Access to the resources needed for treatment.

4. Graces in professional and apostolic life

- Enlightenment in professional or apostolic decisions.
- Opportunities in serving the Church.
- Growth in an apostolate or evangelization project.

The Geppetto Project

"The Lord be with you" - The Archangel Gabriel's greeting to Mary in the Holy House. Within the walls of this home, Mary received the Annunciation and the Incarnation. This is the same home where Mary, Joseph, and Jesus lived after returning from Egypt, so these walls also witnessed the life of the Holy Family. In 1294, their house was saved from marauding Muslims and reassembled in Loreto, Italy. While the basilica that surrounds it is ornate and beautiful, the actual walls are unadorned and rustic.

In the shadow of this modest family home, the John Paul II Pontifical Theological Institute for the Sciences of Marriage and Family Life held a weeklong seminar for marriage ministries in July. They invited Équipes Notre-Dame (Teams of Our Lady), Marriage Encounter, Love and Truth, and other movements, representing 6 continents and 25 countries.

The JPII Institute's world-leading scholars presented numerous talks on marriage and family, and, while these were important, the most impactful elements of the week were our synodal discussions, which lead us toward unity. (from Conversations in the Spirit [1.1] See QR code on right to view the entire document)

In a divided and troubled world, the Holy Spirit teaches us to walk together in unity.... "The earth will rest, justice will prevail, the poor will rejoice and peace will return, once we no longer act as predators but as pilgrims. No longer each of us for ourselves, but walking alongside one another." – Pope Leo XIV

Participating in synodal discussions and prayerfully listening to the Holy Spirit speak through each other, we discerned how God is guiding us toward a common mission. During our discussions, the disciples' words on the road to Emmaus rang true, "Did our hearts not burn within us?", as we heard each couple share their love for Jesus and His church.

Don't we already practice prayerful listening during our team meetings?

Can we consider new tools and new structures, like synodal dialogue, to grow stronger in our conversations with each other?

Each marriage ministry demonstrates a unique charism and focus. Some

ministries are focused on marriage preparation and others on accompanying couples in crisis. Teams of Our Lady also has a unique charism: helping married couples strive for holiness. Although each ministry has different charisms, we share one mission: to build up a church of holy families, families that radiate the love of Mary, Jesus, and Joseph to the world. Taking the Holy House of Our Lady of Loreto as our inspiration, let's endeavor to bring others closer to Christ through the lived witness of our Catholic sacramental marriages.
