Paris, December 25th, 1945

On the Feast of the Lord's Nativity

Dear Friends,

Here comes a new year. May it be good for your couple. I pray for you. May God be with you, first sought, first loved, first served. Love one another: when charity grows in your couple, it grows in the Church where you are a living cell. Love each other: Ubi caritas et amor Deus ibi est. Be happy: The Lord expects this praise and those around you, this testimony. Make amends for those innumerable couples where love is extinguished and who close their doors to Christ. Pray for the widows whose sacrifice is a source of life for your family. Help me.

May Our Lady be an honoured and cherished Mother in your home!

Asking God for a Miracle

Father Henri Caffarel's Cause is moving ahead. The drafting of the Cause, the *Positio*, was submitted to the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints. Theologians and cardinal will now examine it.

On their advice, the pope could sign "the decree of the Heroic Virtues," which would then make the Servant of God a "Venerable", thus recognising that Father Caffarel led an exceptional Christian life and that his teachings on marriage and prayer are in conformity with that of the Church.

What can be done, now at the moment? Two answers: it is up to God to act. It is up to us to ask.

It is up to God to act. It is God who proclaims who is holy. The Church, after having declared Father Caffarel "Venerable," which we do not doubt it will do, will wait for God to confirm his judgment by a miracle, due to the intercession of Father Caffarel. The miracle is God's signature, an approval clearly given to the Church of Father Caffarel's holiness.

It is up to us to ask for a miracle. We can ask God for everything through the intercession of Father Caffarel: the simple things and the important things in our lives or those of others. But there is also a particular inspiration: to ask for someone's healing: physical healing, instantaneous, definitive, inexplicable by science and attributed to the intercession of Father Caffarel himself. You have to ask, ask... relentlessly. This miracle will then be the sign that God wants the holiness of his Servant Henri Caffarel to be recognised by the Church.

Asking for a miracle has an apostolic goal. It signifies asking God for Father Caffarel to shine more and more in the Church and in the world. It is urgent to get to know this priest who was filled with God' love, was open to the love of couples, and who led so many people on the path to private prayer (oraison). Asking for a miracle therefore means entering into the will of God, who wants men to receive his love; it is therefore also the Church's mission.

Concretely, what should you to do?

- 1. Ask God for a miracle through the intercession of Father Henri Caffarel. Say the prayer for his canonisation, the first step of which is his beatification.
- 2. When a cure seems miraculous, notify without delay:
- the correspondent of the association "The Friends of Father Caffarel" in your Super-region or Region;
- the postulator: postulator@henri-caffarel.org

They will be able to tell you what to do.

Do not delay! The authenticity of a miracle must be checked quickly.

In conclusion, what is at stake with the beatification that starts with a miracle, is Father Caffarel's influence and, through him, the influence of the sacrament of marriage, of love in couples, companions for eternity. What is at stake is also the strength of private interior prayer (*orasion*).

These challenges are central to God's purpose for the future of humanity.

Let us ask the Lord to respond to our requests, which are for the glory of his Name: God is Love.

"A Pilgrimage in the Footsteps of Father Caffarel"

In a recent exchange of emails, Father Marcovits made this joyful remark to us, "The support underpinning Teams of Our Lady's request for Father Caffarel's beatification continues to grow!"

This is particularly visible in the Spain Super-region. The launch of the "Team Caffarel," with it mission of presenting the holiness of our founder and disseminating his thinking and work, has produced many fruits. The most recent data indicates that 274 couples are members of the *Association of Friends of Father Caffarel* in Spain, not counting numerous spiritual advisers and individual adherents. Nearly 600 people regularly receive news of the cause of canonisation as well as selected excerpts from Father Caffarel's abundant works, which gradually, but tirelessly, are being translated into Spanish. The "Team" also encourages the translation, editing and distribution of his bibliographic work in Spain and Spanish-speaking America; it has already organised two cycles of conferences (available on YouTube), has participated in training sessions and various gatherings of Teams of Our Lady and is preparing new projects. In short, Father Caffarel is becoming better known and loved by more and more people.

But undoubtedly the most innovative initiative was the pilgrimage to France, in the form of a pilot experience, of a group of 13 couples of Team members and a spiritual advisor from the Association. The theme was "In the footsteps of Father Caffarel." Could there be a better way to get to know him than to go to the places where his life and work took place? The group, from various parts of Spain, stayed at Massabielle, the house of conjugal spirituality which belongs to Teams of Our Lady in France and where all the pilgrims really felt at home. The size of the group proved to be ideal because it facilitated travel in a small bus and created an atmosphere of brotherhood and friendship.

The pilgrimage took place over three days and was full of information on Father Caffarel and Teams of Our Lady...



The first day was devoted to a visit to Troussures, the centre of Father Caffarel's activity. A short journey in silence, "as pilgrims" to the small cemetery, and a prayer written especially for the occasion in front of Father Caffarel's tomb will remain forever in the pilgrims' memory. The group spent the rest of the day with the community of the Brothers of Saint John, who now live in the house at Troussures. Brother Geoffroy-Marie shared valuable details about Father Caffarel's life and ministry with us as we toured the bedroom, office and other rooms where the last 25 years of his life were spent.

The second day was spent in Massabielle with the invaluable participation of Father Marcovits. The group got a "first-hand" update on the canonisation process and learned with joy that the writing of the *Positio* had been completed. Father Marcovits underlined the essential traits of Father Caffarel's personality, whom he presented in a simple and precise manner as "a priest at all times and in all places": a person entirely devoted to leading others to encounter the Lord. It was a day dedicated to discovering the depth of the Teams of Our Lady charisma and to learning about the main axes of Father Caffarel's discipleship.

On the third day, the pilgrimage continued in Paris around the Church of Saint-Augustin and the presbytery where Father Caffarel lived from 1945 to 1979 and where Teams of Our Lady were born and began to develop. The highlight of the day was the celebration of the Eucharist in the crypt where Movement's original Charter was promulgated. The group evoked these decisive moments, then after reading the first part of the Charter – the most important part, according to Father Caffarel – all couples renewed their commitment to Movement.



And in the evening unfolded the most moving moment of the pilgrimage: the meeting with Marie d'Amonville, who collaborated with her husband Louis, with Father Caffarel for many years. The latter passed on the responsibility of the movement to them when he retired in 1973. Marie bore witness to God's way of acting, which led her and her husband to accept the heavy responsibility which was proposed to them.

The result of this pilot experience could not be more positive. We all experienced very intense moments that have brought us closer to the history of our Movement, to the life of its founder and have allowed us to deepen the charism that we carry for the world. We are sure that each small group of Friends of Father Caffarel, who come to Paris will easily be able to reproduce this unforgettable experience. We sincerely encourage you to do so.

Treasurer's Report – Financial Year 2021

General Situation

The year 2021 was once again marked by the Covid-19 pandemic. Some subscriptions were received, notably from Brazil, Spain, Portugal and French-speaking Africa.

With regard to the expenses incurred, it should be noted that the impact of the fees for the postulation of the Cause exceeded the amount budgeted for, but then it was a good action undertaken for the Cause. It should be noted that we incurred IT-related expenses: a problem with our website's hosting service, and the creation of an online prayer novena.

Balance sheet of ordinary activities

Father Marcovits and Marie-Christine Genillon have made good progress in the preparation of the documents relating to the postulation, and also with a trip to Rome to meet the 'relator' from the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints.

A few Comments and Clarifications on the Accounts

The Équipes Notre-Dame International association repaid the money loaned the previous year to deal with a problem with the bank.

During 2021, we had no book sales.

In essence, 2021 saw more spending but also more revenue, with a better positive outcome, better than was budgeted for.







FROM FATHER CAFFAREL'S ARCHIVES

THE VOCATION AND ITINERARY OF TEAMS OF OUR LADY,

L'Anneau d'Or, special issue, "A Thousand Couples in Rome," n° 87-88, May-August 1959

In this conference given in Rome in 1959, Father Caffarel returns to the origin of the Teams of Our Lady's Charter. It should be noted that Father Caffarel only gave Team members Private Prayer and the Word of God as Endeavours at the "Teams of Our Lady facing Atheism" talk in Rome in 1970. Up until then, Private prayer was all that was required of Responsible Couples at all levels.

THE CHARTER

The war was ending, prisoners were returning, groups of couples were forming and multiplying. A formidable success! Did all the couples come for the sake of deepening their Christian life? Not so sure. Sometimes, it seems, it was a question of curiosity, the search for human friendships, snobbery. Add to that the fact that older couples, those belonging to the heroic phase, were tempted to relax in the euphoria of rediscovered peace and comfortable old friendships. Was the beautiful momentum that had infused the first groups already exhausted? So much hope had been placed in this blossoming of the groups of couples; should it come to an end?

There was a crisis: but not every crisis ends in failure. How many times, in our meetings with couples, when reflecting on the development of conjugal love, when studying the development of children, had we noticed this phenomenon of crises in the growth of all living beings, and the fact that they lead to progress or regression depending on whether they are well or badly

assumed. What was to be done for the crises in our groups to get beyond it, to promote access to maturity? What could God's will be?

I will not hide from you the fact that it is the Church's history, the study of religious life, which inspired me to find the solution. I looked for what could explain why holiness has never ceased to flower and re-flower in the religious orders over the ages, despite external and internal crises, and I understood that one of the essential factors of the solidity and vitality of these orders was their rule. Why, I then wondered, not propose a rule for married Christians who desired spiritual progress? Not a rule for monks, but a rule for married lay people.

What orientations should be given to this Rule? More mystical, emphasising the Gospel ideal? More legal, determining obligations? No doubt it was necessary to combine the two points of view. This is why your Rule, the Charter of Teams of Our Lady, in the first part fixes the goal towards which it is necessary to strive and in the second part, the means — methods and obligations — to achieve it.

At this important stage in our history, on our pilgrimage to Rome, it seems necessary to me to present the Charter of the Teams of Our Lady with its profound significance to you. I could have started there and dispensed with recounting the Teams' history. But it is the observations and experiences made during the first two phases of the Movement that explain and justify what I would call the pedagogy of our Charter.

First objective of this Charter: to present the Christian ideal of marriage and to determine the means which will enable couples to acquire a better understanding of it. I had understood over the course of previous years, you will remember, that in order to arouse a generous spiritual life in married Christians, it was first necessary to make them discover the greatness of their vocation.

How does the Charter promote this discovery? Through the *monthly study topic* on a subject of conjugal and family spirituality. Your obligation to study this theme during the month, husband and wife together, and then to write down your thoughts to send them to whoever will lead the discussion during the monthly team meeting presents several great advantages. Firstly, it forces you to delve deeper into the subject, to clarify your thoughts, makes you get into the habit of helping each other, husband and wife, in the study of your faith and finally, during the monthly meeting will enable an all the more

fruitful exchange as it will have been better prepared by the person in charge of leading the meeting, thanks to your answers.

The *retreat*, at least every two years, is another privileged means of entering further into the understanding of Christian life. I had noticed this as early as 1939, the date of the first retreat I preached to couples. It is true that some preachers believe that a retreat is not made for this kind of delving into the riches of Christian dogma, but only for prayer, a review of one's life, and the making of resolutions. I think, for my part, that it must have these two objectives, at least when it is addressed to couples, whose religious culture is in great need of enrichment.

But the Charter is not only intended to make people discover the greatness of the Christian faith. It must also provide the means for the couple to live from it. "Woe to sterile knowledge that does not turn itself towards love." Hence a series of obligations (now called Endeavours) whose raison d'être is to make couples progress in Christian life by inviting them to turn to God, the priest, fraternal help and the support of a framework.

Firstly, I present here the many obligations (Endeavours) that lead couples to seek help from God. *Conjugal and family prayer*: Christ, present in the couple through the sacrament of marriage, first expects those with whom he lives to unite with him in the praise of the Father. *The prayer at the monthly meeting*: placed immediately after the meal, before the discussions, this prolonged prayer is the high point of the meeting, the one, I know, which you value the most. *The antiphon to the Virgin*, which each Team member recites every evening, invisibly brings together all the couples in the Movement, from Europe, Africa, America, to ask the one under whose patronage they have placed themselves, to help them serve God ever more perfectly. It goes without saying that the *retreat* presented above as a means of deepening religious knowledge is also and primarily to be considered as a privileged time of prayer.

In inviting couples to turn to God first, Teams also offer them the help of the one person, the priest, who is God's great gift to humanity to lead them to Him. The role of the Team's chaplain or Counsellor is crucial in our Movement. To the priests who come to ask me about this role, I like to say that our Movement — its organisation and its various methods — is essentially an

instrument placed at priests' disposal to enable them to best fulfil their mission as spiritual educators of couples.

Another great help offered by the Teams is *mutual aid*. The mystique of mutual aid, the obligations of mutual aid: between spouses, between couples, between Teams. Mutual aid is one of the definitions of charity. "*Carry each another's burdens*," wrote Saint Paul to the Galatians, "*and in this way you will fulfil the law of Christ*."

Mutual help between spouses is, said Pius XI in Casti Connubii, one of the essential goals of marriage. It should be done every day. The obligation of a monthly conversation between spouses, which we call the "Sit Down," is to be considered in this perspective of spiritual mutual aid: husband and wife together, under the gaze of God, seek out his thinking and his will with respect to their couple in order to accomplish it better. Who can tell the number of households that owe their human and spiritual balance to the practice of the Sit Down? Conjugal and family prayer, joint study of the theme: these obligations (Endeavours) already mentioned are equally means of mutual aid for the spouses.

Mutual help between couples. In one sense, this is the raison d'être of Teams. Remember the passage from the Charter, "Because they are aware of their weaknesses and limitations, because they experience daily how difficult it is to live up to the Christian ideal in our modern world, because they have unflinching faith in the power of fellowship and mutual help, they have decided to form themselves into Teams." All the moments and all the activities of the monthly meeting are directed towards this fraternal help: the meal and the "pooling" where we share news, joys, sorrows, failures and successes, where we ask for advice and help, the "sharing", this cruel and beneficial moment when everyone reports on how they have respected the obligations (Endeavours) of the Charter. Prayer and the exchange of views are also to be seen in this perspective of mutual aid between couples... But as you well know, this mutual aid cannot be limited to the means of mutual aid that we have just examined. It looks out for Team members' needs. We all know of couples it has saved, materially and morally. A letter that I have just received provides me with an example of this — as well as simultaneously being a symbol of it. A woman was between life and death after the dramatic delivery of her child.

She had lost a lot of blood and a transfusion was necessary. Well, all of her Team members spontaneously offered to give blood to save her.

Finally, mutual help between Teams. Our Movement is a team of teams. Thus the older Teams help those who are emerging on the other side of the world, by allowing them to benefit from their experiences. On the other hand, the entire Movement benefits from the example of each Team, from the apostolic dynamism of those in Brazil, from the fraternal friendship which, in Mauritius, made Team members triumph over racial prejudice, etc. ... The testimony of a Belgian couple offering up to God the little child whom death had taken from them, quoted during a retreat, restored peace to a Swiss couple who could not accept such an ordeal.

Our contemporaries, willingly individualistic and outliers, see in a framework only embarrassment, hindrance, prison. Teams, far from apologising, offer their *strong supervision* and their *rigorous discipline* as a help of great value: the Rule firstly and the commitment to respect it that you are asked to take within two years of joining, the control of compliance with the obligations (Endeavours) of the Charter — control: I am not afraid of the word — but control inspired by charity and exercised with the aim of helping the growth of charity, finally the Responsible Couples, who from top to bottom are the guardians of the Rule, of its correct interpretation and application.

I must mention here, at the end of this long enumeration of the help that the Charter offers you, a means of progress which holds a place of honour with us: you are asked to stop periodically to place your life under the beam of light of the will of God, to verify, in loyalty and generosity, in what way you are faithful to it, to specify the resolutions which will enable you to respond to it better.

At the individual level, this method finds its application in the obligation (Endeavour) called *the rule of life*. The Charter, legislating for couples of very different ages, cultures, spiritual formations, can only propose a minimum programme. And so, it also specifies that each Team member must give themselves a rule of life determining the obligations they believe they must impose on themselves in order to better correspond to the Lord's expectations.

At the couple level, it is the famous *Sit Down*. I need say no more.

At the Team level, it is the end-of-year meeting, often called a *review meeting*, where with frankness and goodwill we ask ourselves what reforms should be adopted, what steps forward should be considered so that Team life progresses in terms of prayer, study, fraternal friendship.

Here is then the Charter of Teams of Our Lady, its *raison d'être*, its objectives, its pedagogy, presented too lengthily and too briefly. When, twelve years ago, I proposed it to the groups in existence then, I had a certain apprehension: would it be understood and accepted, would it bring about the solution required by the crisis referred to earlier? In fact, a few groups did leave us, reluctant to adopt a rule. Not without sadness, moreover, because they were very attached to the spirit of the Movement. The great majority accepted it not so much out of enthusiasm as out of confidence.

The years have brought unexpected confirmation of the Charter's validity. We have seen and we see many couples coming to Teams precisely because they offer them a rule in which they find a feeling of strength and security. Does this mean that our Movement on the move does not include a contingent of stragglers and grumblers?... Moses himself in his caravan had some, and I am not Moses, and I am not leading you to a land where milk and honey flow!

Do I need to specify once again that the Charter is not an end in itself, an absolute? If the case is made that one of the obligations (Endeavours) or one of the methods is not a means of advancing charity amongst all couples - which is all that matters — then it will immediately be withdrawn or corrected.

It took three years, from 1947 to 1950, to put the Charter in place. The Movement has been using it for the past nine years and is doing very well.
