Planting a Seed in America:

The Story of François and Annie Vilarem

I think we can safely say that François and Annie Vilarem were the couple most responsible for the spread of Teams of Our Lady in the United States. Through their courageous start of a Team in Los Angeles in 1958, they inspired, couple by couple, the chain that has led to the remarkable flourishing of American Teams. It is a wonderful story.

Annie and François, with three small children, arrived in Los Angeles from Paris in 1957. They were young, lively, attractive, and full of enthusiasm for the spiritual growth they had found through Les Équipes de Notre Dame which they had joined in Paris. François had been a "frogman" with Jacques Cousteau during WWII and had come to California to develop and ultimately run a company that would make wet suits for the newly popular scuba diving. California was definitely a foreign country for them, but one had a sense they loved the freedom and sense of adventure they found in the American west. François spoke fluent English, but Annie struggled, and had the most delightful way of expressing herself, especially in the spontaneous prayer.

After several months in Los Angeles, (Brentwood to be exact), they spoke to their parish priest about the Teams and their desire to start such a group. He pointed them to some young couples, who asked a few other couples, and soon the Vilarems had their "Team." The parish priest agreed to be their chaplain. We were lucky enough to be friends with one of these first couples.

I so remember these early team meetings! The Vilarems brought a sense of joy and spiritual adventure to the meetings, of openness and a simplicity that were quite new to us. We had never heard our own friends, even Catholic friends, speak so openly and honestly about their everyday struggles to be better Christians and better spouses. The Vilarems were truly gifted in prayer, and the time of spontaneous prayer became a time of great richness and depth for all of us. They kept in touch with the International Team in Europe, and the materials, poorly translated as they often were, were the source of our learning all of the dimensions of Team life. They encouraged us to come together as friends between meetings and to help each other with our children, to welcome all visitors in our homes, and to use the Team structure and principles to bring holiness into all the various aspects of our lives. I think it is the spirit that the Vilarems brought to that first team that has animated all of the Teams in America today.

Alain and I moved from Los Angeles to Washington, D.C. in 1961. Through a local priest in Washington, we met Andy and Loretta Favret, Jack and Gerry Lavan, and John and Barbara Green, and Alexandria 1 began. The rest is history. The Favrets with all their spiritual depth and wonderful energy and talent began one team and then another until there are hundreds in the United States today. What François and Annie started 48 years ago has flourished.

François and Annie returned to Paris sometime in the 60's and lived in Garches, which is near Versailles. They always remained close to their original French Team and to us in America. Alain and I visited them in Paris several times, and their children as teenagers often visited the Team families in Los Angeles. A few years ago, one of the Vilarem children came to visit us here in Atherton, bringing his wife and seven-year-old son. It was a lovely time, full of his memories and ours.

Annie died several years ago, and François died December 14, 2005, in Garches. He was 85 years old. Although Los Angeles 1 stopped meeting as a formal Team many years ago, we have all remained close friends. In fact, we are all meeting at Rancho Santa Fe near San Diego in March for a few days. We will be remembering how much François and Annie influenced all of our lives, and all the fun, support and many graces we have shared with each other over the years, all the result of the leadership of Annie and François, and our being the lucky couples in Los Angeles.

the training are sent directly to the aspiring Sector Couples.



In the first week of November, across the nation we celebrated National Vocation Awareness Week. That week was dedicated to pray for more young people to hear the call to be holy priests, deacons and consecrated religious. We prayed that they would be inspired by Jesus Christ, supported by a faith community and they would respond generously to God's gift of

Vocation. This awareness reminds us of our own thank you to all the priests, deacons, and religious who walk with us as couples in Teams of Our Lady. Two vocations walking together.

We would like to share a personal experience on the Endeavors. Many of you have access, have received, or can receive copies of the new Endeavor booklet sets. It is too easy to glance through the booklets and set them aside but our team just recently chose to study one of the Endeavor booklets on the Rule of Life. Spending time with it gave us a deeper understanding of the wisdom of Fr. Caffarel and the International Leading Team (ERI) that set forth the Endeavors (Obligations). We all seem to struggle with what is the will of God in our lives and where he is calling us. It came to light that in practicing the Endeavors we may with confidence find that the Endeavors are a path to knowing and doing His will. The Endeavor of Reading the Word of God and/or attending daily Mass draws one closer and deeper into God's love and what He desires for us as well as strength for the journey.

In this season of Thanksgiving, we would like to thank each of you for saying yes to *Teams of Our Lady* and for all you do for marriage. You are making a difference. We wish each of you a fruitful advent and a blessed Christmas.



"Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch" Luke 5:4

This invitation by Jesus will be our theme for the weekend of the East Province College Meeting at St. Gabriel's Retreat Center in Clarks Summit, Pennsylvania. Regional Couples and Sector Couples from the East Province will meet to pray, share and plan. The weekend will be dedicated to the memory of John Holdsworth, who died August 17, 2019. (John and Justine Holdsworth were installed as Sector Couple on October 22, 2017.)



Having recently completed our base team's, (Clinton Maryland 1), Annual Evaluation Meeting and having just received in the mail the Contribution Letter, gives us pause to apply this Scripture passage to both of these very important Membership Responsibilities (*Life in Teams*).

The Commitment that follows the Team Evaluation comes at a great price. It is hard, sometimes *very* hard, to grow a small Christian community. Each year we peel back where we've been and where we want to go in living this Team life. Frustrated and tired from a day of fishing, the disciples reminded Jesus that they had already been fishing *the whole day*. He invited them to deeper waters and they were obedient. We also are invited to go deeper in the Evaluation and not just treat it as an agenda item. Through honesty and perseverance we become less individual minded and more team oriented.

When we arrived at our Evaluation Meeting, Jim and Ruth Wagner, our RC for the year, surprised us with a different approach to evaluating the year by asking us to ponder two simple questions. On one side of a paper we were asked to write, in the fewest words possible, a definition of Teams of Our Lady. After several minutes with wonderful music, we were asked to turn over the sheet and answer in one word or phrase "What are you looking for?" Talk about deeper waters!

Participating in the annual Financial Contribution to Teams, reminds us of the important work that Teams does in this country and in 90+ other countries, to offer couples a *specific way to holiness* together, helping each other in the Sacrament of Marriage. The monies contributed provide the "fishing nets" (training, materials and travel) for the Teams of Our Lady "disciples."



In the midst of all this serious stuff comes a picnic. The Bethany Beach 1 Team in Delaware invited the rest of the Sector and their Pilot Couple (us). The beautiful Holts Landing State Park provided the environment and the team couples supplied the fun, food and fellowship with families happily playing together. Talk about a *big catch*, this was it.

The Life Before Us Rob and Sharla Walsh

Rob and Sharla made the first official presentation of *The Life Before Us*, (LVDN), Movement in the United States on July 17, 2019, at the National Conference in Navasota, Texas. The presentation was made to the 16 Regional Couples for the USA Super Region. *The Life Before Us* is an outgrowth of Teams of Our Lady for the elderly, ~72 yrs and older, inspired by Fr. Henri Caffarel. This movement began in Versailles, France, started by a team couple, Louis and Marie d'Amonville, after Fr. Henri Caffarel had stepped down from leadership of Teams in 1973.

The Study Guide, *La Vie Devant Nous*, LVDN, is printed only in French and the copyright was not cleared for us to have the material translated into English, so we wrote our own study topic, *Come Pray Together* with an introductory prayer, an appropriate letter from Fr. Caffarel's book, *Being Present to God*, and three study questions for each chapter.

The Life Before Us Movement helps us to understand our great value in our later years, as God's precious creation. We are taught to embrace suffering, form friendships within our group, learn about the Sacrament of the Sick, and pray for our families and friends. These groups are formed by giving Information Sessions at Churches and Retirement Homes, explaining the procedures for the group. Once formed, the group meets one time per month for 1 1/2—2 hours.

We are asked to form a "Leadership Team" in each Province of the United States Super Region consisting of: a priest and three to four individuals. The responsibility of the Leadership Team is to arrange a Mass for the elderly one time per year, know all of the teams that are formed in their Province, pray for them, review the group evaluations at the end of each year, and choose new study topics for the coming year. The Leadership Team also assigns and prepares couples to "pilot" new groups of *The Life Before Us.* At present, we have our Western Province Leadership Team in place: Fr. Excerpt from Fr. Caffarel's book, Marriage is Holy

Rare are those Christians who think of thanking Our Lord for the magnificent gift of the sacrament of marriage. And yet, what would have happened to human love, if He had not renewed it? It was like the lepers and the possessed who waited outside the gates of the cities of Palestine for a Redeemer. The Savior passed by one day and elevated love. He cured it and blessed it. He delivered it from the terrible law of gravity that pulled it towards the animal and from the discouraging influence of routine and satiety. Henceforward love became in dwelt by grace—the energetic, indefatigable grace that ennobles and constantly renews it.

This grace utilizes, with supreme and delicate artfulness, the joys, sorrows and even the faults of love in order to perfect and consolidate the union of husband and wife. In appreciation of this grace of the sacrament of marriage, a certain husband, after a severe crisis had passed, wrote these penetrating lines: "Yes, the sacrament is upon us; we received it without being fully aware of what it was, but we were disposed to receive it. That is why it took root in us; it rewards us now for the vague gesture of confidence we placed in it and returns our love delivered, multiplied and rooted in the eternal."
