HISTORY AT ITS FINEST

Wonderful Memories!

As the first Teams of Our Lady Historian Couple for the United States Super Region, it has been our privilege to begin going through the materials about Team life and events provided by several couples in the Movement. Here are three interesting finds:

- Teams Newsletter, dated June 1973—Father Caffarel, who was stepping down as Spiritual Counselor
 to the Leading Team in Paris, met with the leadership of the US Teams in New York, and planned to
 meet with local team members in both Detroit and Washington DC. Father Caffarel, who did not speak
 English, requested only to meet with small groups because of the difficulty of communicating through
 an interpreter.
- June 27-29, 1980—The first USA-wide Teams event occurred, a Family Pilgrimage to the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington DC. In attendance were 350 Team members (couples and Spiritual Counselors) and 300 children. Couples from Belgium, Martinique and Canada were also in attendance. Hospitality to many out-of-town guests was provided by the local team couples. Father Roger Tandonnet, the successor to Father Caffarel, also attended. Pope John Paul II sent a letter stating his closeness in prayer on this occasion and invoked his Apostolic Blessing. Archbishop Jean Jadot, the Apostolic Delegate to the United States, also sent a letter of greeting and best wishes.
- Detroit Sector Newsletter, dated April, 2016—The lead article was "Detroit Team 1 Celebrates 50th Anniversary in Teams at Sector Day!" The highlight of the Detroit Sector Day was the sharing and witness talks from the Detroit Michigan 01 Team members to all in attendance.

All three of the above events caught our attention as being wonderful memories of Teams Life! What was not surprising in looking at the attendance pages of couples attending the 1980 Teams National Family Pilgrimage, we found members from the Detroit 01 Team in attendance. We also found that Ed Benz from that Team had previously met Father Caffarel in 1970 at an International Training in Assisi. It has been our experience that couples who participate in Team events and serve in leadership roles in the Movement, create wonderful memories. Consider celebrating at sector, regional or national events, those base teams in the United States that are 50 years in existence or more. Celebrate Life!

PRAYER HEROS

Beginning about 3 years ago, my wife and I decided to pray the Rosary as a family every day during Lent. At first, this seemed like a daunting task and something we feared would be easy to put off or come up with every excuse to not follow through. Through persistence, sacrifice, and the reminders by all members of our family of 5, we were able to succeed at this Lenten sacrifice. Out of routine, a desire to have these peaceful 15 minutes every night, and a recognition that our prayers matter to us and others, we have continued this nightly routine over the last 3 years. Some nights, due to the nature of our childrens busy schedules, we have made adjustments to how we engage in our family prayer, such as praying at opportune times in the car which also includes 1-2 nights a week with half the family in the car and the others at home on speaker phone. These changes aren't meant to lessen the intention of the Rosary, but to acknowledge that prayer can happen, despite the busyness of the season of life we are in. It has not been perfect, and on some rare nights, we only pray a decade or two, but we pray and know that if we continue this tradition as long as possible, it will give our children the best possible roadmap of how to incorporate prayer into their adult and future family life. This also applies to us as a married couple. Through the intercession of Mary, we humbly come to her to bring us closer to her son and to give us the strength, courage, and humility to always make prayer a cornerstone of our lives.

FATHER CAFFAREL UPDATE

Continue to pray for the canonization of Father Henri Caffarel. Much work has been done and the process is now in the hands of the Vatican and God. News towards that end may be sparse, however, more prayers, miracles, and work are needed. Noteworthy, one of our NW Region team members was diagnosed with stage 4 lung cancer and moved to Florida seeking expert care. Regardless, for over a year a team couple has coordinated and led a weekly zoom meeting with our Florida couple and other NW Region team couples, praying the rosary for the intercession of Fr Caffarel. Please continue to donate and support Friends of Father Caffarel. In the meantime, let us tell you a little bit about the family of Father Henri Caffarel.

Father Henri Caffarel was raised in a most holy family. His parents Ferdinand Caffarel and Elisabeth, (born Voisin), were married on June 22, 1901 in Lyon, France. Henri Caffarel was born on July 30, 1903. He was close to his brother George who was born in 1906. They were blessed with a musically-talented, close-knit family, which was very active in the parish life of the Basilica of Fourvière in Lyon, France. His extended family also had a very close relationship to the Archbishops of Lyon and had many members as religious in convents across southern France. As such, the Caffarel families played an important role in the diocese of Lyon throughout the years.

Faith and family were center to the Caffarel family. Father Caffarel's father was quite well off, managing his millinery business with a well founded work ethic. His beliefs were grounded in the Catholic faith and he felt that with a healthy economy, anything could be done according to God's plans. His mother was imbued a great sense of piety and had a good sense of humor and great patience with all children. Both parents were very attentive to the education of their children and their faith. The extended family gathered regularly and practiced extreme charity and openness to all throughout all the years of persecutions of the Catholic Church in France.

When Fr. Henri Caffarel's father, Ferdinand Caffarel died in 1949, his mother Elisabeth retired to the hill of Fourvière, to be close to the Basilica and to her brothers and cousins. She was by then a very dignified elderly lady dressed in widow's clothes with a black silk ribbon around her neck and her white hair in a bun. Elisabeth was very affected by the death of her little sister Marie-Louise leaving a feeling of uneasiness that was never talked about. Her second sorrow was the vocation of Henri, but accepted that as a gift from heaven. At that time, Fr. Caffarel was in poor health and subject to frequent migraines. One could understand his mother's concern for her fragile son. After his ordination to the priesthood, he said his first Mass in Lyon and all the cousins and family organized a reception in his honor. It must be said that the environment in which Father Caffarel grew up in, with all his extended familial relationships, was an atmosphere conducive to the formation of religious vocations of which there were many. Clearly, he was blessed with a Christ-centered and Holy family.

ABOUT Young Adult Teams of Our Lady (YATOL), known internationally as Youth Teams of Our Lady (YTOL), was established in France in 1976 by young adults whose parents were members of an international movement for Catholic married couples called Teams of Our Lady. Since its inception, the movement has spread throughout the world with currently over 5,000 members.

YATOL is an international young adult association whose purpose is to create a community for its young adult members to live the double dimension of the Christian life: Being with Christ and sent on a mission into everyday life.

Young Adult Teams Of Our Lady Come Together To Celebrate Faith And Meet With Pope Francis

In August 2022, 200 young adults from several countries came together in Rome to celebrate their faith at their biannual International Meeting of Youth Teams of Our Lady (YTOL). This year's theme was "Nothing Will be Impossible for You". During the week-long meeting, YTOL members from each country prepared a special activity throughout the day to show their faith. The groups also enjoyed daily Mass, prayer, and the Rosary.

"It was an honor to be surrounded by incredible young adults from around the world. As we reflected during our week of retreat, as Christians the ordinary things are where God lives. He doesn't just live in the explosive life-changing moments. God is really in every ordinary thing that we do. All the suffering, all the joy, and all the hope we experience come from God. So it is important as young adults, we remember we can't do it alone. That's the beauty of YTOL, living as a team, and Christ's humanity," Said YATOL National Responsible Stefani Dias.

Because this year's meeting was held in Rome, YTOL members had the once in a lifetime opportunity to receive a private audience with Pope Francis where he addressed the group and they received a blessing.

"We can say that, for Jesus, every young person is a source of hope: the hope of friendship, the hope of journeying together, the hope of setting out on a mission together," Pope Francis continued in his address to encourage members to not be discouraged by society's increasing pressure that success is individual by instead continuing to pursue living as being part of a people who have "the priceless experience of dreaming together, taking risks together, suffering together, and celebrating together."

Reflection on "Vocation and Mission at the Dawn of the Third Millennium"

A highlight of our participation in the 2018 International Gathering at Fatima was the release of "Vocation and Mission." It is a modest booklet of only twelve pages, and it is most readily found today as Annexe 5 in the "Guide to Teams of Our Lady." For us, it answers the questions of what Teams of Our Lady is all about and what is our mission as couples in Teams of Our Lady.

In the Sacrament of Marriage, we are called to a permanent relationship with our spouse that is entered into freely, fully, and forever in our lives on this earth to be faithful to the other and to be fruitful. The vocation of each couple (and their family) is to make their life a communion ("community") with God. In our sacrament, we are filled with and immersed in the Holy Spirit, Jesus's Love, which unites, restores, and slowly perfects our marriage (our unique spirituality which encompasses all facets of two unique human beings). Scripture tells us this in the Gospel of Mark (10: 6-8): "From the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother [and be joined to his wife], and the two shall become one flesh." The vocation of each married couple is to develop and make their conjugal spirituality stronger and deeper.

Our vocation leads to our mission. At the personal level (husband or wife), our mission is to assist our spouse in getting to heaven. And there is an additional mission for each couple that comes through being married and members of Teams of Our Lady. By virtue of our Baptism and Confirmation, we are to participate in the "Apostolic Mandate," which Jesus gave to the Apostles just before His Ascension to the Father (Matthew 28: 19 – 20a). "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." This mission takes place both in the rest of the world and within Teams. In the rest of the world, we "make disciples" by witnessing to how we live our marriage. Within Teams, it occurs when a couple accepts the call to be responsible for/lead an element in the movement. This starts with being Responsible Couple and steps up level by level from there: Sector, Region, Province. etc.
