Why Accept Responsibility for Team Leadership?

We recently had as part of our Gospel on Sunday (John 10) the comment by Jesus where he says, "I came as that they might have life and have it more abundantly". So Jesus you want to give me(us) more life then I presently have and that would look like what?

We can look at the way Jesus lived his life and it is easy for us to see that it literally drained out of his body. He was so for us that not only did he drive himself to exhaustion teaching his close followers but he did the same thing with his emotional life and then with his physical life. Our response to his being for us in this way is to hope that there is still another response that we might choose. Therefore, should we be more active and pro-active, and leave less of us remaining?

The problem that is difficult for us to grab ahold of is that in order to receive more life we have to use up what we presently have or give away the present life. We are not able to run faster if we run slower. No, in order to go faster we have to use all available muscles and energy now and become breathless and in that way we become faster and have more life.

You probably have read things about what is called "burn-out." Generally those articles would give as advice that everyone is to take care of themselves in such a way as to not come close to burn-out. I had a classmate that certainly took care of himself to the extent that he never exerted himself and I would describe him as a slug who would never set any generosity records.

I wonder if we don't all believe the scarcity rule which would say that we are short of everything. We are short of time, short of energy, of brains, of money, of space and the list continues. When we apply this rule to ourselves it is sort of the opposite of how Jesus wants to give us more abundant life. When I presently think of having less than I need, why would I want to push Jesus into giving me more?

Jesus, it is frightening to think of what might happen to us if we accepted more responsibility. We would like to know EXACTLY how much more life you might give us!!!!

News from Our Provincial Couple


Hello everyone in the Northwestern Region! We have recently been at a meeting with the US Super Regional Couple and Team. Our Super Regional Couple's main goal is to get the Teams of Our Lady Movement back to its roots; to operate the way Fr. Henri Caffarel (our Founder) set it up and organized it to be. During our discussions and conversations, it was suggested that our first one, two or three Piloting meetings, focus on the Teams of Our Lady Charter. The Charter is available to read and study on our new website: www.teamsofourlady.org

The Charter is the body of work that Fr. Caffarel submitted to the Vatican in order that our Movement be recognized by the Pontifical Council for the Laity, as an approved Movement of the Catholic Church. All Teams couples are encouraged to read the Charter, and we expect that new Teams that are being formed will be reading and studying the Charter during the first 3 months of the Piloting process. It would be especially important and beneficial for all Pilot Couples and Responsible Couples to read the Charter as it will help reinforce our commitment to this wonderful method of finding Christ in and through our Sacrament of Matrimony, beginning with the piloting process.

We have also been asked to encourage the formations of Sector Teams. A "Sector Team" is a group of people that are chosen from several teams to help their Sector Couple perform their duties. The Sector Team consists of: Information Couple(s), Pilot Couple(s) and, possibly, a Newsletter Couple, an Activities Couple and, later, Liaison Couples. Therefore, do not be afraid to step up to a leadership position, as your Provincial Couple, your Regional Couple and your Sector Team will be there to assist you. We are a large group of active volunteers and we will make Teams work together.

We are looking forward our next meeting when we can catch up on your personal and Teams life.

International Gathering Update

Fatima July 16-21, 2018 (Limited Attendance # available)

There are approximately 46 couples and 3 priests from our Western Province hoping to attend the 2018 Teams of Our Lady Pilgrimage to Fatima July 16 - 21. As there are currently only 210 available slots, for the US, it means that there is only room for 105 couples in terms of room and board. There are 4 Provinces, so there is now a waiting list.

Registration will start on September 15, 2017 and will end on January 15, 2018. The approximate cost per person is between 500-550 Euros. Information of where to send the money for payment will be coming out in September, with the initial deposit of 1/2 the cost will be due on September 15 and the balance by January 15, of 2018.

Cost for Registration includes room and board in Fatima for 5 nights and ground transportation to and from the airport in Portugal. They will start transporting people to the airport in Lisbon from Fatima after 3 pm. Those flying back directly from the Gathering need to book late on Saturday, July 21. In lieu of the Oct 6-8 Griffin Retreat, couples suggested having a Sector event take place in late January or early February when schedules are not so busy. It would be an event to look forward to during the dreariness of winter. Roger and Lynn Porzig volunteered to help organize the event as long as they could get another team to assist. The event may have to be scaled back depending on factors like the availability of a meeting place and available guest speakers.

Finally, with the growth of teams in Oregon City, now up to 5 teams, mostly from St John the Apostle, but also from Christ the King and St John the Baptist parishes, there is interest among couples to sponsor events for TOOL couples and to increase awareness of Teams within the parishes. We have increased participation among our teams in church activities, such as donuts after mass, FUN night dinners before RE, and soup & stations of the cross. Lastly, there is the constant search for a priest, deacon, or sister, to become Spiritual Counselors for our teams. As we have had upon occasion our pastor attend our meetings, his presence has added immensely to our meetings. May God inspire and guide them all!

Embracing the Mystery Teams of Our Lady Marriage Retreat March 10 - 12, 2017



Couples attending this retreat looked at man, woman and marriage through the Sacramental-Liturgical worldview to rediscover the ultimate mystical context of marriage and what that means in the lived experience. Here are the various topics covered over the course of the weekend:

Marriage: The Great Mystery

This presentation provided the ultimate "why" behind marriage. Unless we know the "why" we do not really know "how" to be married.

Who is Man for Woman and Who is Woman for Man?

Our bodies as man and woman speak a language. They have a theology to them. Decoding the language and theology of the body clues us into the secrets of how man and woman can help meet each other's legitimate needs and avoid connecting on the level of each other's greatest fears.

The Art of Christian Communication

There is a specifically Christian way to communicate which is very effective for both preventing and healing hurt and anger.

The Domestic Church

Couples need to exist in a culture of marriage. To have a culture of marriage in the home requires that we have culture of church in our homes. Our homes need to be a 'domestic church.'

Bedroom, Eucharist, Calvary, Heaven

Sacramental marriage finds its ultimate destiny in the Wedding Feast of the Lamb in Heaven and its context on earth in the Liturgy of the Church.

The painting titled, "Peace Lily" incorporates in visual form a summation of the points presented during the marriage retreat. The Peace Lily is a symbol associated with the celebration of Christ's Resurrection, a most appropriate time and theme for a retreat for married couples. The lily on the right represents the husband. It is taller and more angular in character symbolizing masculinity and the man's call to protect woman. The lily on the left, with its more concentric shape, represents the wife, the woman, and is positioned in the manner of the creation of the first Woman, Eve-- at the side of her man and under his protection.

Both lilies lean toward one another symbolizing the principle of the deferential type of love of the Holy Trinity and also the principle that husband and wife must at all times seek to take steps toward one another and toward meeting each other's legitimate needs as man and woman.

Prominent beneath the lilies are robust green leaves. Purposely placed beneath the lilies themselves, the leaves symbolize the fruitfulness born from the couple. The color green is a symbol for life.

The lilies are surrounded by a crown of thorns. Man and woman are crowned in marriage as a king and queen of a new household and a new life together. But the thorns communicate the overarching theme that marital love is marked by martyrdom, a continual dying to self in order to make a gift of oneself to the other. An overarching Crown of Thorns also reminds the couple that the closer each one gets to Christ, the closer they will grow toward each other.

Western Provincial Couple Rob & Sharla Walsh had a busy weekend March 10-12 as they not only attended the TOOL Retreat at Our Lady of Peace Retreat House in Beaverton, Oregon, but also manned a table for *Teams of Our Lady* at St Cecelia Parish for the Archdiocesan Ministry Forum following the retreat Sunday afternoon. This Forum was sponsored by Jason Kidd, Director of Marriage & Family Life, and focused on *Theology of the Body*. Along with the Walshes, Informational Couple Roger & Lynn Porzig, Portland Sector B Couple Steve & Nancy Anderson, and Michael & Katie Gray also attended this event.

In the beginning there were 4 babies...











We were very active in our parish life, but after getting married, we started looking for another option of sharing our faith with a focus on married life. Our beloved Young Adult Group was mostly single friends with different needs and goals, so we asked other couples at our parish what they did to nourish their marriages. Thankfully, several pointed us to this international, but just growing locally in Oregon, "well-kept secret" called Teams of Our Lady.



We invited a few other married friends to "get informed" with us and shared info about Teams on our Young Adult Ministry website seeking other marrieds like ourselves. That was the beginning of Portland Team 5. Funny thing is that of the seven original couples, only one of us had a baby. Within the year, four of us were expecting. We also look at our monthly Teams meeting as an afternoon "datenight" (with encouraging adult conversation/meal/and prayer). What married couple with young kids doesn't appreciate that on a regular basis?!




Message from Tó & José Moura Soares
