We wanted to offer our out going Sector Couple a thank you with a gift they could use and think "Teams of Our Lady"...what better gift to say Teams then a "salad server"?...

The salad server has two parts like a husband and wife one may be a little sharper than the other, but they are designed to work together for service a lone they would only be able to hold a scoop worth, but together they can serve so much more. The two face each other even when apart.

This salad server is made from stainless steel – so they never rust, they stay shiny and strong.

If you turn the server you will see handles. These handles can represent things that can keep the two apart – what keeps us apart? Work, family, money, friends, LIFE...

But there is one rivet to keep the ends balanced, to keep the two together, to help them work as one – when you think about it - that rivet is God, if allowed God will keep our married couple together, keep our married couple in service and keep the husband and wife facing each other – without that rivet the ends would just be a spoon and a fork.
