

THE FIRST TEAM MEETING FEBRUARY 25, 1939



In 1938, a young married woman, Madeleine d'Heilly, approached Fr. Henri Caffarel to ask him for recommendations on how she and her husband, Gerard, an engineer, both in their 20's, could live the Catholic faith in their marriage. Madeleine and Gerard invited three other couples to join them. These four couples, together with Fr. Henri Caffarel, had their first meeting February 25, 1939 and began the journey which has become The Teams of Our Lady.

Coincidentally, Monique Harris has a dear family friend who has experienced first-hand the birth of *Teams of Our Lady* in France. Mme. Yvonne Polack, age 95 was on Le Mans 12 Team. She is the sole remaining member of her Team, joyous and vibrant, eager to share her knowledge of Teams with us.

She now meets with Anne Gallot-Lavallee, from Le Mans 01 Team, who joined Teams in 1945 and who also invited her and her husband Roland to join Teams! She spoke with admiration and love for Fr. Henri Caffarel, whom she knew first hand, of the importance of the sit down and of having a spiritual counselor for guidance on church matters and spiritual topics. She said, "How blest we all are to be part of this wonderful ministry!"

Summary of the Information Couples Training

Action Plan for 2019 and 2020

Paul and Christine Roth, the Information Couple Lead for Portland Sector A opened the training session with an excellent 10 minutes overview of the role of the Information Couple (IC) and outlined the Information Session. In short, the purpose of the IC is

- to share excitement about Teams and what it has done for our marriage & family
- to tell about the movement
- to explain how the meeting is conducted
- to invite couples to join

Martin and Ana then expanded from there and laid out the 2019 action plan for the ICs and gave a glimpse into 2020 ideas. These action plans for 2019 and 2020 were the result of many our discussions between both Sector Couples, the Information Couples Lead, Paul and Christine Roth, and many advisers from the regional and provincial leadership. We also took into consideration that the Sector Team is a new idea for all of us, and many that serve on the Sector Team have not yet had the experience for their respective role.

What we want to accomplish in 2019 is to strengthen our base, growing from the inside out. We do not want to engage in the periphery of our sectors, creating new teams, while several of our existing Teams are low in numbers. Some of our teams have only 4 couples, some even fewer. Strengthening our existing Teams is where our focus must be for 2019. To this end, we must be very visible in each and every parish where we have at least one couple of Teams of Our Lady. The ICs are asked therefore to engage these parishes in coordination with the IC Lead Couple:

- Introducing Teams of Our Lady to the parish priest and administrators
- Displaying our flyers and keeping our trifolds well-stocked
- Getting the permission for information sessions in the parish, advertising the sessions, and of course running multiple such sessions

While engaging such parishes, we will need your support. For example providing the ICs with contacts, assisting in the Information Session, as well as the advertisement in the parish leading up to it. It is invaluable to have the parishioners see one of their own talking about an exciting movement and how it helped them grow stronger in faith as a married couple. Thank you all in advance for your critical support of our ICs in their mission to strengthen our movement.

Then in 2020, we plan to target parishes that do not yet have couples in Teams of Our Lady, possibly growing the number of teams in the sectors.

Spiritual Counselors are yet another need for all Teams in both sectors. We only have one! While engaging with a parish, the IC may sense that there's a possibility to invite the priest ... Another idea shared was who we ask to become a Spiritual Counselors: Vicars, Deacons, Seminarians, Brothers and Sisters.

In addition, during 2019, the ICs are collecting information about our Spanish-speaking community. With this data we can plan on how to create a Spanish-speaking sector of Equipos de Nuestra Señora. We must be confident to have 'critical mass' of couples to initiate a number of Teams more-or-less at the same time, have meaningful Spanish-speaking retreats, and an engaged Spanish leadership team. Couples, Pilot Couples, and Liaison Couples. This is a big endeavor for all of us for 2020 and beyond.

On January 14, both Sector A and B held a first-ever Joint Training Session for all Liaison (LC) and Informational Couples (IC). The training was the result of the collaborative effort on the part of Martin & Ana Keim (Sector A Couple) and Harold & Ginny McNees (Sector B Couple).



The training session was divided into two parts: the Keims led the training for all Informational Couples and the McNeeses led the training for all Liaison Couples, which proved invaluable because it helped to define and clarify the responsibilities of all.

There were over 20 attendees.

- Pilot Couples
- Prayer Couples
- Possibly, a Social Activities Couple

Ongoing training will be held for all of the above throughout 2019/2020.




The Team Meeting

It is probably not surprising but definitely worth reflecting on what Fr. Caffarel spoke of as he stepped away as Spiritual Counsel or to the Movement in 1973. When asked for his opinion on what was the most important aspect of Team Life, after reflecting on the many gifts, he identified the most important:

"He is there, in the midst of these couples gathered together in a room in an apartment, the intense presence of the Risen Lord, alive, attentive to all, loving all of them, with their mixture of good and bad, and anxious to help them to become the kind of people they want to be. He is there, as on the evening of the Resurrection, in the upper room in Jerusalem, when He appeared suddenly to those other team members, the apostles. He breathed on them, saying: 'Receive – the Holy Spirit.' And they became new men. Jesus Christ, in the midst of couples, does not fail to impart His Spirit to them; and those who open themselves to His Spirit – this is something that people learn gradually – to become people of the Holy Spirit. The whole meeting is animated by the Spirit. To these men and women who, in the evening, after a hard day, often arrive exhausted and weighed down with worries, this Spirit communicates Christ's twofold passion: His impatience for the glory of His Father, and His burning and gentle pity for the crowds 'who are like sheep without a shepherd.'

What I have just described is not what it always is, but how it ought to be. For a meeting of a Team which is not first and foremost a joint effort to meet Jesus is something completely different from a meeting of a Team of Our Lady."

THE PROPHETIC NATURE OF TEAMS

I would guess that you haven't been spending that much time thinking about the role of a prophet in our society. And I'm sure that there would be some disagreement about who we should dub prophet, if we were serious about attempting to name those who are prophets today. We could have economic prophets, political prophets, spiritual prophets, health prophets, and so on. When you go to the doctor, it often happens that they tell you what your future is going to look like. I remember going to a wellness woman who was generously telling me that according a certain health standard, I was obese. I was not pleased to hear this. She was being a prophet to me, and I had no interest in listening to her.

My sister played the prophet one time when she said to me, "You pray funny." I was afraid to ask her what she meant, as I knew that she would tell me exactly what she thought. It took a month to sort out that I was developing a prayer voice that was different from my regular voice and eventually I was very thankful for her comment.

What our Jewish ancestors in the faith didn't understand that well, was why God had chosen them. They certainly understood that they were special as everyone who is chosen understands that they are special. God called them to be a light to other nations, so that those outside of the Chosen might see how it looks to live in this world following God's laws. What if he expects the same of us as was expected of Israel? That we be for the rest of the nations what those nations need from us? If that is where he wants us to be strong, then that puts a much different slant on who we are to be as Christians.

I think that many Catholics think it is the responsibility of Jesus to make them feel good when they pray or when they are hurting. Yes, that is possible, but if that is our only expectation we have for Jesus, then we are not only limiting him, but we also limit ourselves in listening to His message.

If we examine ourselves in our motivation for continuing as a Team member, what comments do we hear? I have heard of how it serves the prayer life of the couple and how other couples are able to compliment each others' prayer life and married life. But I'm not so sure I have heard of how a good portion of our ministry has to do with being a light to the Church community and to even those outside of the Church Community.




- -Johnny and his family, who at the tender age of 5 went to be with our Lord yesterday;
