As we approach the Advent season and a new church year we reflect on the beginning of the Gospel message of God's plan of salvation. As a member of Teams of Our Lady it is helpful to examine the role of our namesake, Mary, in God's plan.

In the beginning of the gospel of Luke, the young Mary receives a visit from Gabriel announcing her role in God's plan. Mary questions the possibility of her role "How can this be, since I have no relations with a man?" Gabriel answers that "... nothing will be impossible for God" and provides Mary with a concrete example of God's plan in action. The example was Elizabeth who was thought to be barren, is in her 6th month of pregnancy. Mary's response to Gabriel's message serves as a model for us all -- "May it be done according to your word."

Mary proceeds with "haste" to visit Elizabeth. She must be thinking about Gabriel's words and possibly thinking -- I want to see God's plan in action.

When she arrives, Elizabeth "filled with the Holy Spirit" greets her with "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb. And how does this happen to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" Elizabeth explains how she knows that Mary is carrying the Savior because the baby in her own womb leaps for joy at the sound of Mary's voice. Elizabeth continues "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled."



What a blessing from the Lord that must have been for Mary. Not only to confirm the angel's proclamation, but to also hear support and joy in Mary's choice to participate in God's plan. It is in this spirit of joy and humility that Mary gives us the prayer we use daily, the Magnificat.

Lord we pray that we can respond like Mary when we see a glimpse of your plan. May we also experience the joy expressed by Mary when we act in your service. May God bless us.
